



Jo Rita Mathews

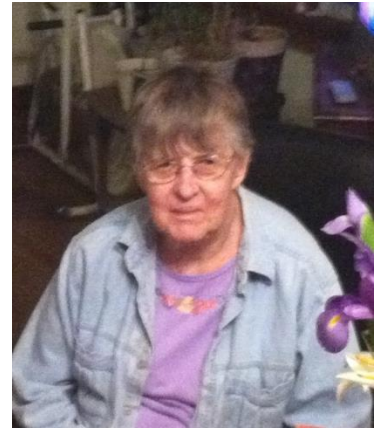
July 17, 1932 – June 26, 2013

Jo Rita Mathews, 80, longtime Lemoyne resident, died Wednesday, June 26, 2013 at her daughter's

home in Loveland, Colo.

Jo Rita was born July 17, 1932 in Lewellen, Nebr., the daughter of Joseph and Sarah (Copley) Skinner. She received her early education in Lewellen and graduated from Oshkosh High School in 1950.

Preceding her in death was her husband Jerry D. Mathews, and cousins Richard Carey and Duane Carey.
