January 15, 1918 – December 31, 2010

Edith Steudler, 92, longtime Paxton resident, died December 31, 2010 in the Sutherland Care Center.

Edith was born January 15, 1918 in rural Chase County. The daughter of Loren and Blanche Thompson Drumm, she was the fourth of eight girls. She attended School District #24 in Chase County.
